

Instructions to Authors

LUNDIANA publishes every six months reports of original scientific researches in English, Portuguese or Spanish in the areas of Biogeography, Conservation, Ecology, Evolution and Taxonomy mainly from the Neotropical region. Texts can be published as a full paper, short communication or review papers that are also considered when previously agreed with the editorial board. Submitted manuscripts after preliminary review by one of the Editors, will be reviewed by at least two referees.

Ethical considerations will be taken into account in considering the acceptability of papers, and the editor's decision on this, as on other aspects, will be final.

Manuscripts should not have been published previously, or submitted simultaneously for publication elsewhere.

Three copies of the manuscript must be submitted, arranged mainly in the following order: Title; Authors; Addresses; Short title; Abstract; Keywords; Introduction; Material and Methods; Results; Discussion; Acknowledgements; References; Figure Legends; Tables. Pagination must be continuous throughout. For the initial submission of manuscripts for consideration, hardcopies are sufficient. For the rapid processing of accepted papers, also submit one electronic copy of the manuscript at this time (a 3 1/2" sized disk of your manuscript prepared on PC-compatible computer. Most word processing packages are acceptable, although any version of Microsoft Word is preferred).

Please follow these guidelines carefully

- Include an ASCII version of the file on disk, together with the word processor version, if possible.
- The hard copy must be printed using double spacing and may be used if setting from the disk proves impracticable.
- Ensure that the files are not saved as read-only.
- Ensure that the version of the hard copy and the file on disk are the same.
- The disk should be labelled with the file title, author name(s), hardware and software used to generate the disk file.
- Do not include copyright material, e.g. word processing software or operating system file, on the disk.
- Authors are encouraged to suggest up to five names of researchers capable to act as referees to the submitted manuscript, including native speakers of the language in which the article is written. In this case, authors should include e-mails of the suggested referees.

Pack floppy disks in such a way as to avoid possible damage in the post.

The name and full electronic and postal addresses of the author to whom readers should address correspondence and offprint requests should be indicated on the first page. The publishers will send proofs to this author and address unless contrary instructions are written on the manuscript. Please do not use right justification if using a word-processor, and do not hyphenate words at the right-hand margins in the manuscript.

Type specimens for new taxa must be deposited in a recognized repository prior to publication. Spell out the entire scientific name the first time a species is mentioned; thereafter, abbreviate the generic part of the name (first letter and period) except at the beginning of a paragraph or sentence. New taxa should be indicated by the Latin abbreviations 'sp. n.', 'gen. n.', etc. Descriptions and diagnoses should be written in telegraphic style. Use SI units and standard abbreviations. The international codes of

nomenclature should be followed.

Manuscripts must be typed on one side of the paper, double-spaced with ample margins, preferably on A4 paper. Tables must be on separate sheets, and should be self-explanatory. Figure legends should be grouped together on a separate sheet. Three numbered copies of text and figures are required; original figures should not be forwarded until the paper is accepted for publication.

Special care should be taken when preparing the manuscripts, since only minor corrections will be accepted in the proofs.

All original artwork and photographs should be in form of glossy half prints of professional quality; line illustrations may also be produced on a high-density laser printer if they, too, are of professional quality. Prints should be pasted to heavy mounting board and clearly labelled by figure number. Colour plates are printed by special arrangement only. Measurements should be given in SI units.

References should conform to the "name and date" system and should be arranged according to the alphabetical order. All the authors of a given paper should be listed in the respective reference. Personal communications or work in preparation must be cited in the text only and should not appear in the list of references. Papers in press or already accepted may, however, be included in this list. Follow these formats:

In citing references within the text, follow these Formats: "Drake & Harris (1945)", "Espinola (1975)", "Pereira et al. (1993)," or, "(Drake & Harris, 1945; Espinola, 1975; Pereira et al., 1993)." Use "et al." when the reference has three or more authors.

Twenty five off prints of each paper are provided free. More copies may be ordered at current prices when proofs are returned. Authors may be required to pay for excessive alterations of proofs.
